LESSON: Lord's Name in Vain

LESSON SYNOPSIS

Part One

Lesson One

- 1) Take not the Lord's name in vain. **"Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain: for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain." Deuteronomy 5:11**
- 2) Say expressions like: "Jesus have mercy on this person or this situation." Or, "Jesus Christ help the devil not to be involved in this situation." Or, "Jesus," when speaking to a dog who is barking and moving aggressively towards you to stop it.
- 3) Third Old Commandment: **"And God spake all these words, saying, ⁷Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain; for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain." Exodus 20:1,7** Father God will hold you guilty for taking his name in vain.

Part Two

Lesson Two

- 1) "Lord!" and sometimes you will hear, "Oh, Lordy!" or "My God!" or "Jesus Christ!" These are expressions, not statements. People often imagine these are statements like "Lord have mercy." They are often completed in one's mind or in one's good intentions.
- 2) Making Violating the Third Commandment, more of a substitution for a more profane word or expression like *@#% or h-e-double hockey sticks.
- 3) The use of the word Lord or Jesus or God is an expression which should be followed by other words to proclaim, ask, say something to the Lord concerning what you are so excited about
- 4) So much worldliness in a person that they believe it is okay not to follow the Ten Commandments. This is disobedience and rebellion.

Part Three

Lesson Three

- 1) "Lord God Almighty!" is an expression you may hear. It is an exclamation used to express one's excitement, amazement, or disbelief in what was just said or just seen. You got God's attention, now what are you going to do with it?
- 2) Check yourself after you say these expressions to understand whether the spiritual place you are in when you say it, is worldly, carnal, holy, or ungodly.
- 3) Lord or God is not the name of our Heavenly Father. Yahweh, El Shaddai, Yahshua, and Yeshua are some true names of our Father, our Brother, our Savior.
- 4) You believe in your heart that the word God and Lord are the names of the Father. You believe when you use those words you are using them as an expression of Father God. That is a problem.

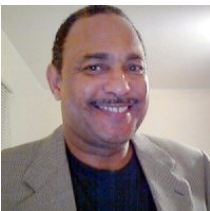
- 1) These vain expressions violate the Third Commandment.
- 2) **Then said Jesus unto them, When ye have lifted up the Son of man, then shall ye know that I am he, and that I do nothing of myself; but as my Father hath taught me, I speak these things. John 8:28 Jesus spoke what the Father had Him to speak. We are to speak what Jesus spoke.**
- 3) Most other speaking is vanity and does not move us towards our spiritual nor divine nature. **“But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.” Matthew 4:4**
- 4) As Christians, we must use the name of the Father and Jesus to promote an atmosphere or spiritual place for healing, miracles, signs, and wonders

LESSON LEARNED: Do not allow your faith, your belief, your intelligence, nor your zeal take you to a place of vanity.

³⁵A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things. ³⁶But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. ³⁷For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.” Matthew 12:35-37
